#### **COUNCIL ITEMS:** \* DiRemigio - Proposed the city purchase three new refuse trucks for the Sanitation Department as apposed to buy one at a time and switching them out. \* Read an article in the news paper concerning things happening in the community such as the coal industry. The article touches on everything he said four years ago when he, as mayor, formed the Progressive Energy Council. The City of Moundsville can accomplish a lot more for Marshall County and the State of West Virginia. The city needs to purchase the available ground that already has shipping docks near the water front. Vice Mayor DiRemigio would like to work with the State, the Federal Government, Belomar and Project Best to acquire the means of a coal to gasification or coal to gasoline plant, which Marshall County had south of Moundsville some years ago. Coal to gasification solves all the problems. Coal presently generates 53% of all electricity in America. Moundsville, Marshall County could be the energy center of the country. Vice Mayor DiRemigio would like the city to pursue the coal to gasification plant for the future of the City of Moundsville. \* Haynes - Asked Manager Hendershot if he could obtain a price on the property behind Elby's. Manager Hendershot reported the figure is approximately \$500,000. \* Reported that he, Manager Hendershot and Fire Chief Clarke met with Bridgeport WV Ambulance Service. The meeting was very informative. Meetings if the Fire and Ambulance Committee will be taking place at the City Building on Friday mornings at 11:00 a.m. \* Lemasters - Wished to thank the Street Department for help the Recreation Department. \* Oiler - Also wished to thank the Street Department for working on Eighth Street. \* Simms - Nothing at this time.
