* Phil Remke, 227 Jefferson Avenue, asked for council's written support for a WV Hall of Fame in Moundsville by using Sanford School, if the levy passes.

After further discussion, Councilperson Simms made a motion to direct the City Attorney to draft a resolution to support the WV Hall of Fame, seconded by Councilperson Haynes. Motion carried unanimously.

* William Baker, 24 Park Street, commented that he thinks that Moundsville should have a transfer station to transport garbage from Moundsville to the dump.

Council explained to Mr. Baker they found that having a transfer station was not feasible for Moundsville because the container will not hold much more than one truck load on compacted refuse.

* Sharon Tucker, 1218 Fifth Street, said that she owned property on Highland Avenue and didn't receive a notice pertaining to the easement (unused portion of Highland Avenue abutting 199 S. Highland Avenue) that Garen Francis of 199 S Highland Avenue was requesting. She also stated that she called the city building to find out information and nobody would help her. She asked that council table this easement until she receives some information.

Mayor Wallace asked Manager Hendershot why Mrs. Tucker was not notified. City Clerk Hewitt advised that Mrs. Tucker was not on the list that Building Inspector Wise obtained from the court house. The list is a 200 ft radius of the property in question. Certified letters are sent to those residents that explains the easement requested. Mrs. Tucker's name was not on the list, that is why she did not receive notification. The Clerk also advised Mrs. Tucker that she will need to speak with Mr. Wise on the plats and what Mr. Francis' intentions are.

* Brenda Olnick, 77 Walnut Avenue, complained that neighbors are still calling the police on her and her husband when they are having company or a cook out. She also stated that her husband is no longer doing business in city limits. She was advised that the problem is a civil matter and she would have to speak with an attorney.

36	Councilperson Simms made a motion to approve the ordinance for a Charter Change concerning
37	Section 15 "City Attorney", seconded by Councilperson Lemasters for discussion.

39	Councilperson Haynes believes that council puts their faith in the City Manager and trusts him
40	with the day to day operations they should trust in him to appoint a City Attorney. Mayor
41	Wallace and Councilperson Oiler agreed.

Attorney White explained the most efficient method is to pass an ordinance which would change the charter. If any citizen of Moundsville objected, the ordinance would die. Council would then have to decide whether or not to place that item on the ballot. If the ordinance passes tonight, the second reading will have to be at least 30 days after the first reading. The second reading will be held on June 6, 2006.

Vice Mayor DiRemigio stated that he was not in favor of any charter changes. But if council would ever need a charter change, Vice Mayor DiRemigio would advise council to appoint an eleven person review board to make changes as opposed to ordinances making the changes.

Vice Mayor DiRemigio also stated that if council can always request an opinion from another attorney if they need to. A charter change is not necessary.

After further discussion, Councilperson Simms made a motion rescinding his motion for the charter change, seconded by Councilperson Lemasters. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and Approval of an Ordinance for a Charter Change Concerning Section 42 of the City Code Pertaining to "Contracts for City Improvements." (First Reading)

Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only to be passed by council on first reading:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE, WEST VIRGINIA AMENDING AND REENACTING SECTION 42 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE TO RAISE THE LEVEL OF CITY IMPROVEMENTS REQUIRING COMPETITIVE BIDDING FROM \$2500 TO \$10,000. (FIRST READING)

Councilperson Simms made a motion to approve the charter change ordinance, seconded by Councilperson Oiler.

Mayor Wallace called for a voice vote. City Clerk announced the following tally. 6 yeas. Motion carried unanimously.

Other Items to be Discussed by Council.

* Councilperson Simms commented that he is not against the contract for the Volunteer Fire Department. He finds a problem with the \$5,000 increase when the city's employees need increases before the volunteers.

* Vice Mayor DiRemigio also commented that he is not against the Volunteer Fire Department, he only wanted to designate \$5,000 specifically for a ladder truck.

MANAGER ITEMS:

Appointment to the Moundsville Housing Authority. (Manager's Appointment)

Manager Hendershot received a letter from Dorothy Petros expressing her interest in serving on the Moundsville Housing Authority. Manager Hendershot commented that Mrs. Petros has much experience in senior housing and is being appointed to that vacancy.

Vacancy on the Moundsville Building Commission.

Manager Hendershot announced a vacancy on the Moundsville Building Commission. A request from Rusty Wolfe has been received asking to be reappointed to the Building Commission. The Building Commission has to recommend to council who they wish to appoint.

Mutual Aid Agreement Between Moundsville and Washington Lands.

The Moundsville Fire Department received a request from the Washington Lands Volunteer Fire Department for a Mutual Aid Agreement. Manager Hendershot asked council to send this request to the Policy Committee.

Timber Process Update at Moundsville Landfill.

Manager Hendershot spoke with Stegman & Schellhase today about one line in question, which was holding the city up on going out for bids on the timber. The city will be installing a low water bridge at the landfill. Once that is completed the DEP will cap the landfill. They will clear an area of timber in the process. Manager Hendershot recommends putting the timber out for bid so they are sure to get the timber sold before DEP caps the landfill.

Jefferson Avenue Sidewalk Project. (Jefferson Avenue Extension)

The Jefferson Avenue sidewalk project is ready to go out to bid. Manager Hendershot is waiting on Stegman & Schellhase to put the booklets together. Also, work is being finished with Stegman & Schellhase on the handicapped sidewalks for Jefferson Avenue Business District.

Sanitary Board Member Residency.

At Sanitary Board Meeting a Sanitary Board members residency was questioned. Manager Hendershot reported the Sanitary Board Attorney researched the matter noting that William McConnell has a legal residence in the City of Moundsville and meets all requirements.

MAYOR ITEMS:

Mayor Wallace wished to thank the previous Mayor's of Moundsville for their work and patience

for the Water Treatment Plant project. Also, wished to thank the Water Board members for their 2 hard work in making this project happen. 4 **COMMITTEE REPORTS:** Discussion and Approval of Recommendations by the Finance Committee. 1. The Finance Committee recommends donating \$30 for Mayor's Choice and \$30 for Manager's Choice for the Annual Uptown Car Show. Councilperson Lemasters made a motion to donate a total of \$60 for the Annual Uptown Car Show, seconded by Councilperson Simms. Motion carried unanimously. Discussion and Approval of Recommendations by the Traffic Committee. 1. Discussion of Paving Priority List. Councilperson Simms made a motion to proceed with putting Jefferson Avenue from Eleventh Street to Twelfth Street out for bid, seconded by Councilperson Haynes. Motion carried unanimously. Discussion was also held on paving Henrietta Avenue at Ninth Street. Manager Hendershot informed council of the discussion that the Street Department could pave the street. After further discussion, Councilperson Simms made a motion to proceed with paving the intersection of Henrietta Avenue at Ninth Street, seconded by Vice Mayor DiRemigio for discussion. Councilperson Haynes remarked he is 100% agreement with paving the street but feels that it is too big of a job for the Street Department. They still have a shortage of workers. Mayor Wallace announced a motion and second was made to have the Street Department pave the intersection of Henrietta Avenue at Ninth Street. Motion carried unanimously. **COUNCIL ITEMS:** * DiRemigio - Made comment to council not having to raise taxes in the city for several years. Also made comment that the city should be accumulating money but the city is not in the banking business. The city's purposes are not to save money but to save money on what we do efficiently. * Commented that our Fire Department and the Volunteer Fire Department must work together in order for Moundsville's rate from a 5 to a 4 which would save the citizens of Moundsville approximately \$400,000 per year on their homeowners insurance. Also, several fire hydrants in Moundsville need replaced immediately.
