Councilperson Wood made a motion to authorize the City Manager to sign the contract with M&H Logging for timber, seconded by Councilperson Simms. Motion carried unanimously. Discussion and Approval of a Resolution of the Council of the City of Moundsville, West Virginia, in Support of the School Improvement Bond Issue. Councilperson Wood made a motion to approve the School Improvement Bond Issue, seconded by Councilperson Simms for discussion. Councilperson Simms remarked that he would support the bond issue personally, but as a councilperson at large he can not. Mayor Wallace and Councilperson Haynes agreed with Councilperson Simms that council as a whole should not be endorsing the School Bond Issue. Councilperson Wood and Simms rescinded the motion and second. **MANAGER ITEMS:** Street Paving Update. The streets being put out for bid are Locust Avenue, Ohio Street and Eighth Street between Henrietta and Juniper Avenues. Jefferson Avenue from Eleventh Street to Eighth Street is one of the most expensive streets to pave. However, Manager Hendershot spoke with Susan Yoho, Director of the Museum, advised him that they have bids in for their expansion which included a driveway on Jefferson Avenue and closing the driveway on Eighth Street. Update on Jefferson Extension Sidewalk Project. Manager Hendershot met with WV DOH District Engineer, Bob Whipp, who is tentatively in agreement with the engineering changes on the Jefferson Extension sidewalk project provided by OH-WV Excavating. To continue the process, the city will have to have Mr. Whipp's approval, submit drawings and obtain approval from the grant agency in Charleston. If the city is approved there is a chance of more grant funding. Manager Hendershot also contacted the manager of
