16	Ricky Young have been submitted. Mayor Wallace made a motion to appoint Mike Lauter to fill
17	a full term, Ricky Young to fill an unexpired term, seconded by Councilperson Simms. Manager
18	Hendershot noted that one vacancy still exists on the commission.

37	* Councilperson Cunningham noted that he is not in favor of charging citizens \$3.00 per item,
38	such as chairs, couches, dressers, etc., to be picked up by the Sanitation Department. Further
39	discussion was held on the rates of sanitation and Manager Hendershot will contact other
40	communities to see what they charge for extra items.
41	
42	* Councilperson Cunningham asked why the minutes haven't been placed in the paper. Mayor
43	informed him that the matter will be looked into.

- * Councilperson Lemasters received complaints of sump pumps pumping onto city streets. Street Commissioner Richmond advised that ordinance states that citizens who are using sump pumps are to pump to the curb onto streets or alleys.
- * Councilperson Lemasters asked Manager Hendershot about the letter from James V. Kelsh concerning District #4 Water Purchase Contract. Manager Hendershot explained that the Moundsville Water Board made an offer to the Public Service District #4 in reference to their filing appeals to PSD 4's expansion project. They were asking for a 5 million gallons minimum sales agreement, which was figured into the Water Plant construction. Presently, they are buying 6 million gallons. Manager Hendershot wanted to bring this matter to council's attention in case PSD #4 accepted the offer because it would eventually would have to come to council. At this point, PSD #4 has not chosen to enter into the agreement with the Water Board.
- * Councilperson Simms asked if council was in agreement to find the employees a raise for this new budget. And asked that figures could be presented to council at the Finance Meeting. Simms also asked why salaries in the Police Department has risen \$37,000. Manager Hendershot stated the cost is for the Resource Officer at the Moundsville Jr. High, but the School Board has offered to pay half of the cost.
- * Councilperson Lemasters stated that he would like to have a break down of all employee salaries, insurance, etc.

MANAGER ITEMS:

Moundsville Police and Fire Pension.

Council was provided copies of the bank statement from Fire Department Pension and Relief Fund from July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2006. And also a similar statement from the Board of Trustees of the Police Pension. Manager Hendershot announced because of the new auditing principles (GASB) that have been put into place have required some changes such as an Actuary Study done on both the police and fire to see if there was an net pension obligation, which would be the difference that is owed now as compared to what would have been owed to the pension had the city been on the standard payment throughout. The amount of money that the pensions would be short because of the change would be considered a general fund obligation. After the Actuary Study, Manager Hendershot found that the city has no obligation to the pension, both pensions are funded the way the city is suppose to fund them.

Cub Scout Cake Bake.

The Cub Scout #78 are sponsoring their annual Cake Bake on March 19, 2007 at 6:00 p.m., at the Calvary Methodist Church. Councilpersons and Department Heads usually donate money to purchase a cake. Councilperson Wood has volunteered to attend.

Annual Antique Car Show. The Marshall County Chamber of Commerce is holding their Antique Car Show on June 1, 2007 (Rain date June 8, 2007) and has asked the city to sponsor \$30 for Mayors Choice and \$30 for Managers Choice. Councilperson Simms made a motion to sponsor the Mayor's and Manager's Choice for a total of \$60, seconded by Mayor Wallace. Motion carried unanimously. Appeal Hearing for Tri State Water Consultants Inc. Manager Hendershot requested that council schedule an appeal hearing for Tri State Water Consultant Inc., whose city solicitation license were suspended due to fraudulent statements. Councilperson Simms suggested the hearing be set for March 20, 2007 at 6:00 p.m. Other Items to be Discussed by City Manager. * Letters sent to Legislatures, Senators and Congressmen directed by council received responses back from US Senator Byrd and WV Senator Kessler. * The Moundsville Police Department and Fire Department Haz-Mat Team received high praise in the After Action Report from the 2006 Mock Disaster. The joint Haz-Mat Team is one of a few, if not the only one in the state. * Commendation letters have be given to officers involved in a "stand-off" on Monday night on First Street. Officers commended are Pfc. Mike Lloyd, Sgt. Shelva Smith, Cpl. DeWitt, Detective Taylor, Lt. Robinson and Sgt. Helms. * Letter of Thanks was received from the Moundsville/Marshall County Public Library for the city's continuing support and funding. * Attorney White submitted four legal ads published in the Moundsville Daily Echo to be received and filed by council: 1. Bids for Timbering Sales 2. Ordinance for Term of Mayor 3. Ordinance for Appointing Committees by Mayor 4.
