Motion carried unanimously. 23 24 **GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:** 25 26 * Ed Anderson, 206 S Highland Avenue, provided council with aerial views of his and his neighbors property and plat maps from the Marshall County Court House showing both 27 28 properties are in city limits. Mr. Anderson wants to know if the neighbors are right beside him, 29 why is he in the city and they outside city limits?
