* Councilperson Saunders presented proof of abandonment for the property located near the East End Ballfields and behind Curtis Avenue. The ordinance first reading was July 23, 1991 and signed by former City Clerk Loretta Francis. Mr. Saunders asked if the Manager would verify this ordinance as being recorded.

* Councilperson Haynes asked if the process has been started on the vacant house at 49 Linden Avenue? Fire Chief Clarke reported that address not being on his list but will be added.

* Councilperson DeWitt asked if the city was going to be able to start paving this fall or have to wait until spring? Manager Hendershot reported paving will hopefully be started toward the end of next week.

* Councilperson Young received more complaints on the property and tree at 317 Poplar Avenue. Chief Kudlak reported the tree has been trimmed but unaware of the property.

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion and Acceptance of Supplemental Agreement #1 for Twelfth Street Sidewalk.

Manager Hendershot reported having a \$80,000 grant for the Twelfth Street sidewalk project. There was an oversight in the invoice process which caused the city to over expend on the project. Manager Hendershot explained the situation to Jeff Harpold, Department of Highways Grant Program, who advised they had some grant money that was not expended and they could put \$28,481.00 toward the project leaving the city \$7,000 balance to pay.

Councilperson Haynes made a motion to approve the supplemental agreement for the Twelfth Street project, seconded by Councilperson Young.

Mayor Wood called for a voice vote. City Clerk announced the following tally. Wallace, Young, Mayor Wood, DeWitt, Haynes, Saunders and Simms. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Hendershot reported there could have been more Brownfields money available, but because the clean up is basically complete there is no need for another Brownfields grant. RAZE has knocked down the last building. There is a small amount left on the grant because Belomar did not spent all that was projected in the grant. Belomar has
- 92 not yet closed the grant. RAZE has received their full amount of \$141,000. Because it took the

- 93 demolition a little longer to complete, Thrasher Engineering went over their contract by \$6,000.
