Councilperson Saunders reported that he will speak to the Parks & Recreation Board and advised that Acting Recreation Director Mark Baker has contacted the Army Corp of Engineers to set up a meeting.

* Councilperson DeWitt asked if the WV DOH has conducted a study for a turn signal for the bridge at 12th & Lafayette Avenue. Manager Hendershot has not had any contact with DOH concerning that specific issue.

* Councilperson Saunders asked if the city was ever going to provide for an ambulance service in Moundsville. Concerns that there won't be enough calls left throughout the rest of the county to maintain a paid ambulance service were discussed.

 * Councilperson Saunders asked if the Police Department have been using the weight scales? Acting Chief Whipkey said the department has received complaints of trucks off the truck route and by the time the officers respond, the truck is gone. Also, the scales need to be hauled to the site with some help of the Street Department.

* Councilperson Haynes reported a resident of Highland Avenue was complaining that every time there is a storm they lose power because of trees hitting the power lines. Manager Hendershot advised that AEP trimmed the trees to their specifications. He will call AEP again advising them of the problems residents are still having.

* Councilperson Wood, concerning the street light request on Fourth Street, asked if the city was moving forward with that request? Manager Hendershot reported that he made contact with AEP, who no longer use the process of requesting the installation the city is then charged a little more each month for the electric and pole. AEP quoted the installation of two poles at \$800-\$900 for each pole.

Manager Hendershot suggested raising the lumen in the lights in that area.

* Councilperson Remke what council plans to do about the buildings on Jefferson Avenue that are being used as storage or warehouses for junk. Manager Hendershot reported the owners received letters that they are listed in the vacant building registry and will have to start paying the city for the building being vacant.
