Haynes, P. Haynes, Simms, Wood and Mayor Saunders. Absent: Remke. Also present: City 12 Manager Hess, Fire Chief Clarke, Police Chief Mitchell, Street Commissioner Richmond, 13 Building Inspector Richmond, Attorney Thomas White, CPA Kathryn Goddard and City Clerk 14 Hewitt. 15 16 Special Council Meeting of February 19, 2013. 17 18 Councilperson P Haynes moved to accept and approve the minutes of the special council meeting 19 of February 19, 2013, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt. Motion carried unanimously. 20 21 Regular Council Meeting of February 19, 2013. 22 23 Councilperson DeWitt moved to accept and approve the minutes of the regular council meeting 24 of February 19, 2013, seconded by Councilperson P. Haynes. Motion carried unanimously. 25 26 Special Council Meeting of February 28, 2013. 27 28 Councilperson P Haynes moved to accept and approve the minutes of the special council meeting 29 of February 28, 2013, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt. Motion carried unanimously. 30 31 GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING: 32 33 Wheeling Mayor Andy McKenzie - Presentation on Home Rule Pilot Program. 34 35 Mayor Andy McKenzie explained that Home Rule allows municipalities to decide what is best 36 for their city without going through legislation. Dilapidated structures is one of the major 37 problems in Wheeling and Home Rule has allowed the City of Wheeling to force property 38 owners to renovate, sell or tear down their dilapidated structures. A bill to extend and open up 39 the program to include class III, IV & V cities has been introduced to legislatures. Mayor 40 McKenzie suggested should the City of Moundsville is interested in Home Rule express to 41 legislatures that you are interested and start thinking of ideas and issued that need addressed. 42 43 \* Jim Kudlak, 126 S. Highland Avenue, owner of one campground site on 12th Street, opposed 44 the \$10 fee for each camper stating that city licenses are not suppose to be used as a revenue 45

generator. Also, council increase rental B&O Tax from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per \$100. The camp site owners also pay \$7.50 Municipal Fee and \$5.00 StormWater run off fee for each camper.

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\* Brad Varlas, 1107 12<sup>th</sup> Street, reiterated Jim Kudlak's comments and hopes that council reconsider the ordinance.

\* Barbara Bettanizzi, 1501 Water Street, informed council members that she was present for the requested zone change on a parcel of property across from the Prima Marina. The property is zoned RN and she requested a zone change to CCCH. She noted that she requested this zone change so she can continue to use the property to store boat trailers and docks as she has done in the past several years.

\* Walter Rhome, owner of property at 15th & Water Street said that his letter stated the request was from RN to Industrial (I) not CCCH.

\* Sidney Wood, 1500 Diamond Street, asked council's permission to remove the wheels from his trailer (1500 Diamond Street) and make storage unit. Council members encouraged Mr. Wood to speak to the Building Inspector on this issue.

\* Donna Martino, WV Housing Development Fund, introduced herself and left informational packets with council containing literature for first home buyers, low finance loans for demolition, etc.

\* Carl Boso, 305 Tenth Street, asked council if the property owner has CCCH zone would they still be able to have campers should their property be less than the 1 acre required. Attorney White answered the property owner must have at least 1 acre to have camp site.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

Discussion and Approval of an Ordinance Pertaining to Trailer Camps in the City of Moundsville. (Second Reading)

Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only to be passed by council on second reading:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE, WEST VIRGINIA, ENACTING SECTION 735 REGARDING RULES, REGULATIONS AND LICENSE FEES FOR TRAILER CAMPS IN THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE. (SECOND READING)

Councilperson Wood moved to accept and approve the camping trailer ordinance, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt for discussion.

Councilperson Wood assumed the \$10 fee was an annual fee, not \$10 for each camper on the site. Councilpersons DeWitt and Simms agreed. Attorney White noted as the ordinance reads

the \$10 fee is for each camper. 1 2 After further discussion, Councilperson Simms moved to table this ordinance sending it back to 3 the Policy Committee for changes, seconded by Councilperson Haynes. Motion carried 4 unanimously. 5 6 Other Items to be Discussed by Council. 7 8 \* Councilperson Wood reported meeting with Professor Margaret Stout, WV Students and 9 committee members concerning updates on the Comprehensive Plan. They will return on April 10 26 & 27. 11 12 \* Councilperson D. Haynes commented the streets on the paving list for last year should be the 13 first ones to be paved this year. He referred this discussion to the Traffic Committee. 14 15 **NEW BUSINESS:** 16 17 Re-appointment of William McConnell to the Moundsville Sanitary Board. 18 19 Councilperson P. Haynes moved to re-appoint William McConnell to the Sanitary Board, 20 seconded by Councilperson DeWitt. (Property owned by Barbara 25 Bettinazzi) 26 27 Councilperson Wood moved to direct the City Attorney to draft a zone change ordinance from 28 RN to CCCH, seconded by Councilperson Simms for discussion. 29 30 After further discussion, Mayor Saunders called for a voice vote. D. Haynes, P. Haynes, Simms 31 voting yea. Wood, Mayor Saunders, DeWitt voting nay. 3 yeas, 3 nays. Motion failed. 32 33 Councilperson Wood moved to send this matter to the Policy Committee for further discussion, 34 seconded by Councilperson DeWitt.
