26	* Shirley Cook, Wesley Park, complained of people riding ATV's around Wesley Park &		
27	Highland Avenue they can't set on their porch the noise is so loud.

29	* Bob Roberts, 91 Highland Avenue, complained of ATV's in neighborhood. He said he called		
30	the police but didn't see an officer. This problem goes on all summer.

32	After some discussion, Councilperson Remke moved to discuss the city's ATV ordinance at the

35	* Mary Phillips, Mound Town Music, 276 Jefferson Avenue, asked when the Jefferson Avenue

39	when called. She reported and has pictures of a man driving an ATV with an infant on front and		
40	a child in the back. Another rider was naked on his ATV going up and down the street. She		
41	feels there is going to be serious injury to someone.

43	* Tim Gast, 90 N Highland Avenue, also spoke on the matter saying ATV owners are taking the		

spark arrester out of the muffler and putting the end cap back on making it look like they have a working muffler. He reported kids riding double popping wheelies when the boy on the back fell off catching himself with his hand causing road rash.

* Carl Boso, 305 10th Street, reported 8 to 10 ATV's riding down 10th Street every evening going to the walking trail. He commented that ATV riders must have proof of insurance if they are driving on the street.

* Tom Doyle, 103 Cherokee Drive, asked when Jefferson Extension was going to be paved. City Manager reported that we are unsure due to the fact that Jefferson Extension is a state project.
