22 3	GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:			
24 25 26 27 28 29	* B J Schillaci, 713 Second Street, said he attended a council meeting on May 20 and assured that Mr. Rickrode was not going to install a gate across the alley between Morton Avenue & the Eagles parking lot. This alley has been opened for many years and maintained by the city. He asked who authorized Mr. Rickrode to install the gate.			
30 31 32 33	Attorney White commented that he provided an opinion to council stating from historical interest of a 1924 deed the alley was established for "the use in common with the owners of all other property adjoining thereon." The owner of the alley intended it to be used only by its adjacent property owners, making the alley private and not open for public use.			
34 35 36 37 38	Mr. Schillaci provided a petition from residents opposing the installation of the gate. He also commented this act was unfair to the neighbors who used that alley all the time. Councilperson Remke moved to receive and file the petition, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt. Motion carried unanimously.			
39 40 41 42 43	* Ben Schillaci, 718 Second Street, said installing the gate on this alley is an inconvenience to everyone. The city has maintained this alley for over 30 years. He doesn't feel that allowing Mr. Rickrode to install the gate is fair to the surrounding neighbors who have lived there for many years.			

- * Richard King, Uniquely Yours, 305 Jefferson Avenue, expressed concerns of Jefferson Avenue being closed again by the Sanitary Board for repairs. He asked that council and city manager consider the business owners when closing Jefferson Avenue since they were not aware the street was being closed for a second time.
- * Terry Phillips, 278 Jefferson Avenue, read an article provided by Councilperson Remke concerning UMAC and business owners on Jefferson Avenue. He commented closing Jefferson Avenue again was unfair to the business owners because they were unaware of the Sanitary Board project.
- * Teri King, Uniquely Yours, 305 Jefferson Avenue, commented the sidewalk repair done on Jefferson Avenue is horrible, the colors of concrete do not match and somebody placed foot prints in the sidewalk.
- * Francis Tucker, 115 Morton Avenue, reported owning property on Morton Avenue for many, many years and gating the alley on Morton is unfair to the surrounding property owners. He stated this has been an alley for as long as he can remember.
- * Theresa Gouldsberry, 264 Jefferson Avenue, commented that she and her granddaughter own one of the properties that this gate was installed on. She also commented she was installing a gate on another piece of her property to keep people from walking through to Jefferson Avenue and littering on it.
- * Mark Johnson, 109 Morton Avenue said he has lived in the same house since he was a child and remembers the alley being used by all residents in that neighborhood. He thinks council and the property owners who installed the gate should think of the elderly people who use that alley to walk to Jefferson Avenue.
