18	Regular Council Meeting of September 2, 2014.
19	The second of the regular council
20	Councilperson P. Haynes moved to accept and approve the minutes of the regular council
21	meeting of September 2, 2014, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt. Motion carried
22	unanimously.
23	CENTED AL DUDI IC HEADING.
24	GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:
25	* Ben Schillaci, 718 Second Street, feels Attorney White over stepped his bounds by giving his
26	opinion that permitted Mr. Rickrode to install a gate in the alley. He feels that Mr. White's
27	opinion only benefitted one person. He asked again to have the yellow line removed in front of
28	Mr. Rickrode's residence.
29	Mr. Rickfode's residence.
30	Councilperson Remke passed out to council members the deed from 1924 that said, "to the use in
31	with the express of all other property adjoining thereon, of a certain alley ten (10) 100t III
32	width cituated immediately in the rear of said land hereby conveyed, at such time as said affects
33	opened, and said parties of the first part shall have the right to garden or otherwise use the said
34 35	alley way until such time as said alley is opened for use as an open alley."
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37	* Helen Tucker, 115 Morton Avenue, said the alley has been maintained by the city for many
38	years.

40	* Donald Bonnette, 113 Morton Avenue, said he wants council to vote to re-open alley.

42	* Mark Johnson, 109 Morton Avenue (rear), feels there is a conflict of interest between City

Attorney Tom White and Mr. Rickrode's Attorney Harry Moore, Jr. He advised council that he

received a letter from Attorney Moore accusing them of harassing the Rickrode's. Mr. Johnson also asked if the city paved private property for Rickrode's shouldn't they pave private property for every other citizen?

After some discussion, Councilperson Remke asked council to discuss that matter of pursuing it in circuit court at a finance meeting, seconded by Councilperson D. Haynes. Motion carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

Other Items to be Discussed by Council.

* Councilperson Wood said he read in Parks & Recreation Board minutes something has to happen with the boat docks or the city will have them removed. Any update on the docks. Manager Hess advised DNR will get back to her.

* Councilperson Remke said he asked about attending a Bel-O-Mar Meeting and was told by Mayor Saunders that he could not attend. Mayor Saunders said the public is not invited to the Executive Meetings but able to attend regular meetings.

* Councilperson Remke provided Manager Hess with a list of yards that need cut.

* Councilperson Remke reported the street locator sign at Purdy Avenue & POW MIA near Past & Present Bike Worx has been removed.

* Councilperson Remke made a motion to take to Policy Meeting the position of a Code Enforcement Officer, seconded by Councilperson Simms. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Hess explained to council that high grass complaints are reported to the Police Department via work orders. The Police Department will receive the complaint, send a letter to the owner of the property. If there is no action taken, the owner receives a citation to appear in Municipal Court.

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion and Approval of a Resolution Concerning EPA Clean Power Plan.

Councilperson Simms made a motion to approve the resolution concerning EPA Clean Power Plan, seconded by Councilperson P. Haynes. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and Approval Authorizing the City Manager to Enter into an Agreement with WV Department of Highways Concerning a Temporary Construction Easement through City Property.

Councilperson Remke made a motion authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with WV DOT for a temporary construction easement through property located on Jefferson Avenue Extension south side of bridge, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt. Motion carried 4 unanimously. Councilperson D. Haynes suggested earmarking the money received from DOT for something 6 specific. Councilperson Simms made a motion to send to Finance Meeting, seconded by 7 Councilperson D. Haynes. Motion carried unanimously. 8 9 Discussion and Approval of an Ordinance Establishing Tobacco Free Zones on City Owned 10 or Operated Outdoor Recreational Facilities. (First Reading) 11 12 Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only to be passed by council on first 13 14 reading: 15 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE WEST 16 VIRGINIA, AMENDING ARTICLE 1106 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF 17 MOUNDSVILLE, RELATING TO ADDING AND AMENDING A SECTION DEALING 18 WITH BANNING TOBACCO PRODUCTS BEING USED AT CITY OWNED 19 OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES. (FIRST READING) 20 21 Councilperson Wood made a motion to approve the above ordinance, seconded by Councilperson 22 23 Remke. 24 Discussion was held on the properties included in this ordinance such as the Riverfront Shelter, 25 playground and property; Valley Fork Ballfield-both girls & boys, Soccer; Four Seasons Pool, 26 East End Basketball Courts, Skatepark, ballfields and playground; Park View Playground; and 27 Walking Trail at Valley Fork. 28 29 Manager Hess explained a complaint was received by the Health Department reporting smoking 30 at Valley Fork Soccer Field. The Health Department notified the City Manager who had to make 31 changes to the ordinance already in place in order to enforce the ordinance. 32 33 Attorney White pointed out the fine is listed at \$250 per offense. Normally, the fine amount is 34 set by the judge for up to \$500.00. 35 36 Councilperson Wood moved to rescind his motion and Remke rescinded his second. 37 Councilperson Remke made a motion to send this ordinance to the Policy Committee to amend 38 the fine amount, seconded by Councilperson Simms. Motion carried unanimously. 39 40 Discussion and Approval of Date and Time Set for Trick or Treat in the City of 41 Moundsville. 42

* Councilperson Remke reported grass needs cut next to 112 Highland Avenue.

At the time of the bid, Mack had available line spaces for 2015 chassis to be built in December 2014. Mack available line spaces are in January 2015 and chassis will be build as 2016 year models. Mack has announced a 3% price increase for 2016 year models. WV-Ohio Motor Sales was able to make an agreement with Mack Trucks Inc to honor the price quote, for 2015's, and will provide the city with 2016 year model chassis at no additional cost. McNelius has also agreed to honor pricing for packers.
