The Council of the City of Moundsville met in regular session in the Council Chambers on February 3, 2015 at 7:00 p.m.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor David Wood.

Invocation was given by Councilperson K Mark Simms.

- 11 Acting City Clerk Ankrom called the roll and the following councilpersons were in attendance: DeWitt, 12 David Haynes, Paul Haynes, Hendershot, Saunders, Simms, and Mayor Wood. Also present: City
- Manager Hess, Police Chief Mitchell, Assistant Fire Chief Walker, CPA Kathryn Goddard, and
- 14 Attorney Thomas White. Absent was City Clerk Hewitt and Public Works Director Richmond.

MINUTES:

Regular Council Meeting of January 20, 2015

Councilman Paul Haynes made a motion to accept the minutes of the regular Council meeting of January 20, 2015, which was seconded by Councilman Simms; and motion carried unanimously.

GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:

Dr David Hess, Kevin Britt, & Rich Wilson - Reynolds Rapid Care Center

Kevin Britt, Chief Operating Officer at Reynolds Memorial Hospital, and Rich Wilson, Director of Facilities, were in attendance and apologized that Dr David Hess was kept away by a patient emergency. They explained that Reynolds Rapid Care Center will be opening in the former pet store at the plaza across from WalMart in Moundsville. Mr. Britt stated that the "retail medicine" trend will continue to expand in the future, mostly due to the "milennial generation," who don't seem to connect with a primary care doctor as older generations have; and, in this area, the influx of non-resident workers push the demand for urgent care facilities. Work will begin March 1, with plans to have the facility open by July 4, 2015. The facility will be open every day, during limited hours, with the capability to do x-rays and lab work, and it will be staffed with local nurses and doctors.

Presentation of Mayor Plaque to Vice Mayor Eugene Saunders

Mayor Wood noted that Vice Mayor Saunders was not honored at the previously-held Mayors reception, as he was still the active Mayor at that time. Therefore, Mayor Wood presented a certificate and plaque to recognize and thank Vice Mayor Saunders for his diligent service to the city of Moundsville.

* Carolyn Duffy of 5 Brockuner Street notified Council that heaters in the women's locker room at 4 Seasons Pool are not working properly, and gaps in the windows allow cold air inside the pool area. She commented that several people have stopped using the facility and do not plan to return. Manager Hess confirmed that the heating system is being addressed. It was noted that recommendations were made to keep the pool water between 82 and 84 degrees.

- * H Carl Boso Jr of 305 10th Street asked to be considered for an exemption, from the Vacant Building Registration Fee, for his properties on Fostoria and Poplar Avenues. He was informed to see the City Manager for the exemption. Mr. Boso also asked about permits needed for ATVs shoveling just on the
- 49 sidewalk, which is required.

Discussion of Applying for Grant to Brownfields Abandoned & Dilapidated Building Funds and Letter of Support

Rick Healy of BelOMar reviewed the process for applying for the Brownfields Abandoned & Dilapidated (BAD) Technical Assistance Grant. Mr. Healy feels that Moundsville is a great candidate for the grant, and BelOMar is eager to work with City officials throughout the process. The grant is competitive, awarded based on a scoring process, and does not include monetary funds but is a services grant valued at up to \$10,000.00.

One of the main principles of the program is to re-introduce a dilapidated property into the local market. "Stakeholders" from various facets of the community, along with City officials, are needed to work throughout the process to identify and prioritize dilapidated properties. The team members will be trained on issues and opportunities pertaining to redevelopment; how to identify and survey buildings to develop a bad building inventory and create a redevelopment plan; and how to research absentee owners and approach them.

Grant applications are due by February 13, 2015. Mayor Wood prepared a draft application, which was forwarded to the Brownfields Assistance Program for comments; and BelOMar is working on a final draft of the grant application. Grants will be awarded on February 27, 2015, and eight cities in West Virginia will be chosen. Mr. Healy reviewed a timeline of events that will take place between now and next spring, should the City receive the grant.
