MARCH 17, 2015

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The Council of the City of Moundsville met in regular session in the Council 4 Chambers on March 17, 2015 at 7:00 pm. 5

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7 Meeting was called to order by Mayor David Wood.

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9 Invocation was given by Councilman K Mark Simms.

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- 11 Acting City Clerk Ankrom called the roll and the following Councilpersons were in
- attendance: DeWitt, David Haynes, Paul Haynes, Hendershot, Simms, and Mayor 12
- Wood. Absent was Vice Mayor Saunders, who was out of town. Also present: 13
- Acting City Manager Hewitt, Fire Chief Clarke, Police Chief Mitchell, Public Works 14
- Director Richmond, Building Inspector Richmond, CPA Kathryn Goddard, and 15
- Attorney Thomas White. Absent was City Manager Hess, due to illness. 16

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18 **MINUTES:**

- 19 Regular Council Meeting of March 3, 2015
- Councilman Paul Haynes made a motion to accept the March 3, 2015 minutes as 20
- Motion was seconded by Councilwoman DeWitt and carried 21 presented.
- 22 unanimously.

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Special Council Meeting of February 24, 2015

- Councilman Paul Haynes made a motion to accept the February 24, 2015 Special 25
- Meeting minutes as presented. Motion was seconded by Councilman Simms and 26
- carried unanimously. 27

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GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:

- Rick Yanen of 100 Spruce Street presented Council with a petition of 22 30 signatures from residents of Highland Hills. The residents are concerned about the 31 condition of the streets and low water pressure. Mr. Yanen praised the garbage 32 workers and street sweepers, as they do an excellent job! Also, Stormwater 33 Superintendent Bonar installed a drain across Harmony Drive that has helped 34 immensely with keeping water drainage from pooling and icing on the roadway. 35 Mayor Wood confirmed that Spruce Street and Harmony Drive are on the paving 36 priority list and will be engineered. Councilwoman DeWitt suggested having the 37
- Water Board correct the water pressure before paving in the area. Councilman 38
- David Haynes explained that the Water Board has looked at the water pressure issue 39

and, according to the meter readings, they meet minimum regulations as required by the Public Service Commission. Discussion was held on residents installing individual bladders and/or tanks to increase the water pressure in their homes.

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Theresa Thomas of 1211 Agnew Street expressed concern about the dangerous intersection at Agnew Street, turning onto Parriott Avenue. The residents of the corner house on Parriott Avenue park on the street and the view of oncoming traffic is often obstructed. Director Richmond extended the yellow line on that corner curb; and the Police Department has checked to make sure vehicles are legally parked. Discussion was held on installing a mirror on the pole across the street from the intersection.

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Doris Archbold of 1107 Parriott Avenue also expressed concern about the intersection of Agnew Street and Parriott Avenue.

- 20 questions or comments on the 2015-2016 Levy Estimate. Hearing no comments,
- 21 Councilman David Haynes made a motion to close the Public Hearing. Motion was
- 22 seconded by Councilwoman DeWitt and carried unanimously.

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24 **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 25 Discussion and Approval of an Ordinance to Abandon a Portion of an Alley Running
- 26 from Purdy Avenue to Lockwood Avenue Between Eleventh Street & POW Street
- 27 (Marshall County COOP Property) (Second Reading)

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- 29 Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only:
- 30 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE, WEST VIRGINIA, VACATING, ABANDONING, AND
- 31 ANNULLING A PORTION OF AN ALLEY BETWEEN PURDY AVENUE AND LOCKWOOD AVENUE
- 32 (SECOND READING)

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Councilman Simms made the motion to approve the ordinance on second reading, which Councilman Hendershot seconded.

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Mayor Wood called for a roll call vote, and Acting Clerk Ankrom announced the following tally: 6 yeas. Motion carried unanimously.

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Discussion of Revising Article 355 Motorized Recreational Apparatus Vehicles to

Require Proof of Insurance (Second Reading)

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- 3 Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only:
- 4 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE TO AMEND AND REENACT ARTICLE 355 OF THE
- 5 MOUNDSVILLE CODE PROVIDING FOR A PROHIBITION AGAINST THE OPERATION OF CERTAIN
- 6 MOTORIZED RECREATIONAL APPARATUS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF
- 7 MOUNDSVILLE UPON ANY PUBLIC STREET, ALLEY OR PROPERTY; TO MAKE THE OPERATION OF
- 8 SUCH APPARATUS A CRIMINAL OFFENSE; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES THEREFORE; AND TO PROVIDE
- 9 EXCEPTIONS (SECOND READING)

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11 Councilman David Haynes made the motion to approve the ordinance on second 12 reading, which Councilman Paul Haynes seconded.

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14 Mayor Wood called for a roll call vote, and Acting Clerk Ankrom announced the 15 following tally: 6 yeas. Motion carried unanimously.

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Other Items to be Discussed by Council

- * Councilwoman DeWitt has noticed that no work is being done on the former
- 19 DiCarlos Pizza building. Inspector Richmond explained that the building is scheduled
- 20 for demolition. Acting Manager Hewitt commented that the property is also being
- 21 handled through Moundsville Municipal Court.

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* Councilwoman DeWitt asked if there is a project start date for the Jefferson Avenue Extension bridge? Acting Manager Hewitt will find out.

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* Councilman David Haynes commented that the Department of Highways has delayed the Route 2 bridge work again.

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NEW BUSINESS:

- 30 Discussion and Approval of the 2015-2016 City of Moundsville General Fund Budget
- 31 Councilman David Haynes made a motion to approve the 2015-2016 General Fund
- 32 Budget, which was seconded by Councilman Paul Haynes.

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- CPA Goddard explained that, after reviewing costs associated with the Police Officer position being left vacant, there were some figures that could not be included in the calculations; therefore, the allocation of salary increase per remaining officer was
- 37 slightly less than originally expected.

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39 Motion to approve the 2015-2016 General Fund Budget carried unanimously.

Discussion and Approval of a Recommendation by the Moundsville Planning Commission to Approve a Zone Change from R-M to C-C-C-H at 1109 Purdy Avenue (Marshall County CO-OP Property) (First Reading)

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- 5 Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only:
- 6 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE, WEST VIRGINIA, PROVIDING TO CHANGE A
- 7 CERTAIN DESIGNATED AREA ON PURDY AVENUE IN THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE FROM A MULTI-
- 8 FAMILY RESIDENTIAL ZONE TO A HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL AND INTEGRATED COMMERCIAL
- 9 **CENTER ZONE (FIRST READING)**

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11 Councilman Simms made the motion to approve the zone change ordinance on first 12 reading, which Councilwoman DeWitt seconded.

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14 Mayor Wood called for a roll call vote, and Acting Clerk Ankrom announced the 15 following tally: 6 yeas. Motion carried unanimously.

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Bid Award for Street Department Loader

- 18 Director Richmond confirmed that two bids were received: 2015 Komatusu Wheel
- 19 Loader from ICR Equipment & Supply for \$138,120.00; and 2015 Case Wheel Loader
- 20 from Southeastern Equipment Company for \$162,099.78. The new loader will
- 21 replace his department's current equipment, which is an obsolete 1993 model. The
- 22 Komatusu is a better model and available for immediate delivery. Councilman
- 23 Simms made a motion to accept the bid from ICR Equipment & Supply for
- 24 \$138,120.00. Motion was seconded by Councilwoman DeWitt and carried
- 25 unanimously.

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- 27 Discussion and Approval of a Resolution Authorizing the Application and Contract
- 28 for West Virginia Governor's Community Grant Participation Program Funds in the
- 29 Amount of \$10,000.00 (Moundsville Water Department Equipment)
- 30 The 2015 grant funds will be used toward a valve insertion tool, costing about
- 31 \$52,000.00. The Moundsville Water Board will provide a 10% match and is also
- 32 seeking financial assistance from the County Commission and other resources.
- 33 Councilman Simms made a motion approving the resolution authorizing the
- 34 application, which was seconded by Councilman Hendershot and carried
- 35 unanimously.

- 37 Discussion and Approval of a Resolution Authorizing the Application and Contract
- 38 for West Virginia Governor's Community Grant Participation Program Funds in the
- 39 Amount of \$10,000.00 (Computer Program Upgrades)
- 40 These funds will be used for computer software upgrades in the City Clerk's Office

and require a 10% match. Councilman Simms made a motion to approve the resolution authorizing the application, which was seconded by Councilwoman DeWitt and carried unanimously.

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Other items to be Discussed by Council

* Councilman Hendershot thanked everyone who worked so diligently on the budget!

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* Councilman Hendershot thanked the Planning Commission for their effort, as they
have a more difficult job, than Council does, when Zone Change requests come up.

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* Councilman Simms broached discussion on having the City Manager include Spruce Street and Harmony Drive when she drafts the letter to the Stormwater Utility Board. It should be verified whether the Highland Hills area has adequate storm sewers before paving is done.

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* Councilman David Haynes agreed that the water drain issue in Highland Hills needs
to be looked into.

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* Councilman Paul Haynes also feels the water issues in Highland Hills should be taken care of as soon as possible, before paving the streets.

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* Councilwoman DeWitt asked about Kentucky Avenue, which is half out of the Moundsville City limits. Director Richmond confirmed that patching will be done on that street later this week.

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* Councilwoman DeWitt noted that 4th Street, from Clinton to Annadale Avenues, also needs patched.

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MANAGER ITEMS:

Acting Manager Hewitt reminded Council members about the Business After Hours on March 26, 2015, beginning at 5:00 at the Grand Vue Park Banquet Hall. Bob's Lunch will be catering the event sponsored by Noble Energy. They will have the first ever "Pitch Contest" sponsored by the West Liberty University Center for Entrepreneurship. Anyone interested in going should contact Secretary Kaufman.

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Acting Manager Hewitt read a letter from Berry, Kessler, Crutchfield, Taylor, &

Gordon regarding the natural gas line replacement at their office. The law firm is willing to bear the expense of repairing the sidewalks, as long as Council agrees that the three Bradford Pear trees, in front of their office, do not need to be replaced. The tree roots will cause future damage to the sidewalk. Councilman Simms made the motion to allow removal of the sidewalk and trees, which was seconded by Councilwoman DeWitt. Councilman Hendershot broached discussion on the Bradford Pear trees and the issues they cause with liability. The State of West Virginia will not mow the median on Lafayette Avenue because of the trees growing there. This is definitely an issue that should be looked at. The motion, to allow Berry, Kessler, Crutchfield, Taylor, & Gordon to remove the trees and replace the sidewalks, carried unanimously.

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MAYOR ITEMS:

Mayor Wood read a March 12, 2015 letter from Delegate Michael Ferro in regard to the Community Participation Projects, which will not be funded for the 2016 Fiscal Year.

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Mayor Wood informed Council of some legislative updates, including the Home Rule legislation, which did pass; however, Governor Tomblin has not yet signed this legislation. The Governor is expected to veto the Firearms Act of 2015; and there has been contention over the 30-day extension of Hotel/Motel Tax.

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Mayor Wood commented that Vice Mayor Saunders accompanied Gayle Manchin on tours of the Blue Racer and Dominion Plants. Mrs. Manchin spoke at last night's banquet at Grand Vue Park, which was supported by the Moundsville Historic Landmarks Commission.

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- Mayor Wood read a letter congratulating Moundsville on receiving the BAD Grant and explaining what steps need to be taken next.
- Mayor Wood informed Council of a drug seminar to be held at the MEDC Training Building on April 13, 2015. The Keynote Speaker will be Federal Attorney William Ihlenfeld.

- Councilman Simms made a motion to have the 2015 Paving Priority List engineered.

- 21 2. The Traffic Committee will have further discussion, at the April Committee 22 meeting, on the request to create a walking trail going up 10th Street from 23 Lockwood to Jefferson Avenue.
