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9 Acting City Clerk Ankrom called the roll and the following Councilpersons were
10 in attendance: Vice Mayor DeWitt, David Haynes, Paul Haynes, Hendershot,
11 Simms, Wood, and Mayor Saunders. Also present were City Manager Hess,
12 Building Inspector Richmond, Attorney White, and Acting Clerk Ankrom.

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Consider an Appeal of the Vacant Building Registration Code Violation for
 Property Located at 105 Hickory Avenue Owned by Arthur Oakland Jr &
 David Oakland

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Arthur Oakland Jr of 1320 9th Street explained that he and his brother have owned the property at 105 Hickory Avenue for several years. Both gentlemen work in construction and feel they have made significant strides inside and outside of the house.

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David E Oakland of 113 Tomlinson Avenue stated that he and his brother purchased the Hickory Avenue home as a long-term investment project. They want to be selective about who they rent to, and they have not taken any "short cuts" in the remodeling process. Mr. Oakland stated that an additional six months would be a great help!

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The Oaklands purchased the Hickory Avenue property before the Vacant Building Registration Ordinance was enacted, and, they did not plan to rush

- 1 through the renovations.
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Inspector Richmond provided to Council copies of pictures of the inside and
outside of the property and confirmation of payment of the 2013 and 2014
Vacant Building Registration Fees. Inspector Richmond noted that American
Electric Power's delay in connecting electric service is not the fault of the
owners, as all electrical work is adequate.

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9 Councilman David Haynes made a motion to grant Arthur and David Oakland,
10 owners of 105 Hickory Avenue, a six-month extension. Councilman Wood
11 seconded the motion. Mayor Saunders called for a roll call vote, and Acting
12 Clerk Ankrom announced the following tally: 7 yeas. Motion carried
13 unanimously.

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Councilman Simms asked about established criteria in granting extensions in
 these cases. Attorney White explained that it is up to City Council to make
 decisions on a case-by-case basis.

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Vice Mayor DeWitt is of the opinion that this residence should be inhabitable in six months. Councilman Hendershot agreed, stating that the ordinance was drafted to motivate property owners to renovate their properties and not just let them sit in a state of neglect.

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24 Mayor Saunders adjourned the Special Hearing at 6:16 PM.
