19	Councilperson Haynes moved to accept and approve the minutes of the regular council

27	GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:

29	* Jane Klug, 2005 Jackson Street, member of Friends of the Parks & Pool. She said the
30	group will continue to raise money for the pool and they will continue to work with
31	council. She asked that council work together to find ways to keep the pool open. Ms.
32	Klug also commented on the interest of painting the city's parking meters. She subjected
33	painting the meters with pictures of Moundsville History. And lastly, Ms. Klug said there
34	in no "I" in Team!

36	* Miranda Postle, 110 Hickory Avenue, Head coach of the Bishop Donahue & Marshall
37	County Swim Teams and has a child on the John Marshall Swim Team. She asked that
38	council consider the children who utilize the pool.

* Mary Lou Border, 12th Street, asked council to think of the children and the senior citizens that utilize the pool before making a decision to close it.

* Ashley Postle, 110 Hickory Avenue, a John Marshall swim student, commented on the social skills she endured while swimming on the John Marshall swim team. She hopes that council does not close the pool.

* Charles Postle, 110 Hickory Avenue, Asst. Coach for Marshall County Swim Team, opposes closing the pool. He asked council to think of the children.

* Mary Patterson, 9th Street, said council made a motion to move forward with obtaining funds to renovate the pool, why haven't they continued to move forward?

* Bill Dorsey, 205 S. Highland Avenue, President of the Marshall County Swim Team, said he could help with locating parts and equipment at cost. Council needs to reach out to citizens for help.

* Carl Boso, 305 10th Street, asked what council has found out about towing services doing business in the City of Moundsville? Councilperson Hendershot said the City Manager and Attorney are researching his question.

Donald Dulaney & Tiffany Wotring - ESP Emergency Site Protection.

Mr. Dulaney wanted to introduce themselves to city council. ESP wants to be a 911 provider to the City of Moundsville as well as Marshall County. They want to work with the local fire department first responders not replace them. ESP is not under a contract with the Marshall County Commission, but have submitted a proposal to them. Marshall County entered into an agreement with HealthNet Services in Cameron. ESP will also have a working relationship with HealthNet.

Ken Joseph - Tri State Ambulance Service.

Mr. Joseph, owner of Tri State Ambulance Service since 2008, assured council his ambulance service is not leaving Moundsville or Marshall County. Tri State Ambulance Service will provide the same coverage they have been providing for years.

Councilperson Hendershot asked Attorney White if the city should enter into an agreement with the new ambulance service, can the city provide them with exclusivity of 911 calls in the city? Attorney White responded by saying the answer as being very unclear at this time. Attorney White said he would like to confer with the counsel for the

34	* Vice Mayor Wood asked if she researched any further into the Silver Sneakers
35	program? She advised not at this time.

37	* Vice Mayor Wood asked what the process is when entering the pool with payment or a
38	pass. He asked if someone was at the desk making sure people have a pass?

40	* Vice Mayor Wood asked if the concession stand was open for business at the pool?

Manager Hess replied from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

* Vice Mayor Wood asked for an update on the Morton Avenue house. She replied she had nothing further to report.

* Vice Mayor Wood asked Manager Hess for an update on the Delinquent Fee process. Manager Hess said letters have been sent out for delinquencies.

* Vice Mayor Wood asked Manager Hess if she plans to contact Ms. Donahy of the Wheeling Cultural & Arts Commission? Mrs. Hess said yes she would be meeting with her.

* Vice Mayor Wood said the Goals Committee met before the council meeting to discuss the list of goals.

* Councilperson Haynes asked that financial reports of the Parks & Recreation be provided to council members. Mayor Saunders said he would make sure council will have those.

She noted in looking over budget projections, all the fees and taxes collected does not cover any one department in the city, it subsidizes all departments. The pool is running a deficit but feels the children and senior citizen deserve the pool.

* Councilperson Hendershot said, concerning the pool, one of the issues with the swim teams are the fees they pay to the city do not even cover the salary of the lifeguard.

* Councilperson Hendershot asked if Attorney White had an answer for him concerning the towing services in the city? Mr. White said he had no answer for him.

* Councilperson Hendershot said he was a little concerned about the deficit showing in the December finances. Looking at the Parks & Recreation, they have expended almost

1 2	100% of their budget. And Parks & Recreation has not taken no action to address that short fall.
