The Council of the City of Moundsville met in regular session in the Council Chambers on September 5, 2017 at 7:00 pm.

7 Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eugene Saunders.

8

9 Invocation was given by Councilman Allen Hendershot.

10

- 11 Acting City Clerk Ankrom called the roll and the following Councilpersons were in
- 12 attendance: Saunders, Dewitt, Haynes, Hendershot, Hunt, Remke, and Wood. Also
- 13 present were City Manager Hess, CPA Goddard, Attorney White, Police Chief Mitchell,
- 14 Fire Chief Clarke, Public Works Director Stocklask, and Building Inspector Richmond.

16 MINUTES:

- 17 Regular Council Meeting of August 22, 2017
- 18 Councilman Remke made a motion to accept as presented the August 22, 2017 Regular
- 19 meeting minutes. Motion was seconded by Councilwoman DeWitt and carried
- 20 unanimously.

- 22 **GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:**
- 23 A) Craig White, Moundsville CVB Financial Report
- 24 Mr. White was not in attendance.

26 No one else wished to address Council.

27

- 28 **OLD BUSINESS:**
- 29 A Discussion and Approval of an Ordinance to Repeal Article 158: Board of
- 30 Parks & Recreation Commissioners (Second Reading)

31

- 32 Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only:
- 33 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE,
- 34 WEST VIRGINIA, ABOLISHING THE BOARD OF PARKS AND
- 35 RECREATION COMMISSIONERS AND CREATING IN ITS PLACE A BODY
- 36 TO BE KNOWN AS THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD, WHICH
- 37 SHALL BE AN ADVISORY BODY TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
- 38 MOUNDSVILLE (SECOND READING)

40 Councilman Haynes made a motion to approve the ordinance abolishing and replacing

the Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners. Motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Wood.

Attorney White explained that, if a non-voting Council liaison is desired, the Ordinance would have to go back to the Policy Committee for redrafting; however, a Resolution could be done to appoint a Recording Secretary.

8 Mayor Saunders asked for a roll call vote, to which Acting Clerk Ankrom announced the 9 following tally: five yeas, two nays; Saunders and Remke voting nay. Ordinance was 10 approved on second reading.

Other Items to be Discussed by Council

* Councilwoman Dewitt asked about paving the intersection of 5th Street and Tomlinson Avenue. Manager Hess has not yet asked Klug Brothers about that.

* Councilwoman Dewitt asked about progress on the RV Park. The sanitary lines are in; water line installation and electrical work should start next week, to be followed by the laying of slag.

* Vice Mayor Wood asked about the painting of parking meters. Manager Hess has talked to the teacher at Moundsville Middle School; however, the Historic Landmarks Commission has not been in contact about that project.

* Vice Mayor Wood commented that Community Day went well! He would like to see
 pictures posted on the City webpage.

* Vice Mayor Wood wants to discuss Council Goals and lighting regulations, at the September Policy Committee.

* Councilman Haynes thanked Inspector Richmond for handling the 2nd Street house.

He feels it is important to address resident complaints as quickly as possible, in the best possible way.

* Councilman Remke asked Vice Mayor Wood if there was any progress on the prospective "Rec Center" at East End. This will be discussed at the Committee meeting.

* Councilman Remke asked about the Washington Avenue property, which is still in process, per Inspector Richmond.

* Councilman Remke asked about the cost of the water and electrical work to be done at

the RV Park. Manager Hess informed the sanitary line work was approximately \$8,000.00; and water and electrical work could cost around \$40,000.00.

* Councilman Remke asked about progress on junk cars, particularly on Park and Oak 5 Avenues. Chief Mitchell explained that some tickets have been issued and orange 6 stickers posted on windows.

* Councilman Remke noted the japanese weeds on 12th Street are out of control again.
Director Stocklask commented that the weeds grow back within just a few days of being cut or sprayed with weed killer. Director Stocklask was under the impression that the Corps of Engineers would take care of these, but that is not the case.

* Councilman Remke would like to see some maintenance done on the shrubbery at 13 Linden Avenue. The trees, grass, and weeds cover and block the sidewalk.

* Councilwoman Hunt thanked all of the Community Day helpers! She commended all of those who worked the entire day, setting up, handing out food and drinks, and cleaning up afterward. Many favorable comments were received from attendees.

* Councilwoman Hunt commented that the Historic Landmarks Commission wants to paint the parking meters black and gold, to match the signs that will be installed. She asked if Director Stocklask could have some scroll work or other decals made.

* Councilwoman Hunt has received more complaints about the road off of Jefferson Avenue Extension to the Dominos/Ked's Ace Hardware Plaza. Manager Hess has contacted the owner several times, with no response. She will send a letter, asking that repairs be made.

* Councilman Hendershot read the article about the new docks, and he thanked the Department of Natural Resources for improving the area! He requested that Manager Hess send a letter thanking the DNR; and he would also like to have a ribbon-cutting.

* Councilman Hendershot is forming a proposal, to present to the Marshall County Board of Education, asking for assistance with Four Seasons Pool. He made a motion to have discussion on this possibility at the September Finance Committee. Motion was seconded by Councilwoman Dewitt and carried unanimously.

* Councilman Hendershot made a motion for Attorney White to draft a Resolution, authorizing Manager Hess to appoint a Recording Secretary for the newly formed Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. Motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Wood and

* Councilman Hendershot noticed in the August 22 minutes that the Recreation Department is already exceeding its budget, just one month into the Fiscal Year.

* Councilman Remke asked that Council be given a detailed, monthly financial report on the Recreation Department.

- 14 Attorney White read the following ordinance by title only:
- 15 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE,
- 16 WEST VIRGINIA, AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING ARTICLE 1107 OF THE
- 17 MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE TO REPEAL THE
- 18 PORTION THEREOF RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF VACANT
- 19 BUILDINGS AND TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE FOR REGISTRATION OF

- 37 Two bids were received, both of which met the specifications. Only Quality Building of
- Millersburg, Ohio attended the bid opening. It was pointed out that local businesses can
- 39 request a form that allows a percentage discount on the total bid; Northwoods
- 40 Construction, based in Moundsville, did not make this request. This project has already

been put out for bid twice. No financing will be required for this project.

Councilman Haynes made a motion to table the bid approval. Motion was seconded by
 Councilman Remke and carried unanimously.

* Councilwoman Hunt was pleased to see that the bids for the Water Department's nanofiltration system came in lower than expected, and that the excess will be applied to water line improvements in Cherokee Hills. Councilman Haynes informed that the line running under the creek will be moved.

* Councilman Remke made a motion to discuss, at the Policy Committee, registration of rental and vacant properties. Motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Wood and carried unanimously.

* Vice Mayor Wood asked about the Poplar Avenue house. Manager Hess informed there are some obstacles at the moment.

* Vice Mayor Wood asked about the Morton Avenue property, which will be demolished.

* Councilwoman Dewitt asked if the nanofiltration system is up and running.
